






Partial Agreement Seminar: 'Youth as promoters of sustainability: the EYC as a tool to reinforce sustainable mobility'

Introduction

Sustainability is a topic with multiple meanings and the young generation is one of its strongest promoters. From sustainable traveling, to sustainable fashion and being more aware of their behavior as consumers, young people are demanding companies and brands to be environmentally aware, while keeping political representatives accountable for their positions on protecting the Planet.

EYCA has as a core mission to encourage youth mobility, as a means to break cultural barriers, empower youth as global citizens and promote human rights sensitivity. The EYC in itself is a tool that offers access to different benefits young people need during their journey: from transport to accommodation, leisure and cultural experiences. We strive to remain sustainable and relevant for young people, as one of the reliable stakeholders in the European youth field.

The seminar offers a space for debate, update and participation of decision makers, young people, youth workers and private sector around the topic of sustainability.

Objectives of the event:

- 1)Create synergies between public sector, youth card organisations, NGOs, young people and companies to advance sustainability in youth mobility;
- 2)Offer a unique space for members of the PA on Youth Mobility to build stronger partnerships with the European Youth Card organisations in their countries;
- 3)Identify concrete ways to use the EYC as a means to provide young people with green and digital services in smart cities (and beyond).

About the organizers

The Partial Agreement on Youth Mobility through the Youth Card exists since 1991 and is a programme of the Council of Europe¹ aimed at developing the youth card scheme, particularly at European level, in the best interests of young people with a view to facilitating their mobility as well as access to the various goods and services necessary for their personal and cultural development.

The European Youth Card Association (EYCA) groups over 35 youth card organisations all over Europe and is the Partial Agreement's statutory partner. EYCA's vision is a Europe where all young people are mobile and active (socially, culturally, educationally and economically). EYCA's mission to reach this objective consists in delivering quality youth card services and in contributing to a better policy on youth mobility and active citizenship. Today, over six million youth cardholders benefit from youth card opportunities.

Government of Euskadi, General Secretariat for Social Transition and Agenda 2023 – Youth Direction is the host of the event and the public institution responsible for youth policies, youth agenda and youth emancipation in the Basque Region of Spain. The institution provides young people with the free European Youth Card, facilitating their transition to economic independence and social inclusion.

Practical information

All participation related costs are covered by the organisers, as it followed:

Accommodation and food will be provided by the **Government of Euskadi** in single rooms in a three stars hotel close to the venue meeting.

International travel related costs are <u>reimbursed</u> by EYCA, through the PA on Youth Mobility, upon receiving the travel documents. Reimbursement will be done in maximum three weeks after attending the seminar.

Transport

The participants are responsible for arranging their own travel possibly in a most economical way. More information about the local transport will be offered at a later state.

EYCA will reimburse international travel costs upon receiving the justificative documents, *up to 400 euros/person* and the tickets need to be booked at least 15 days in advance before travelling.

- Request for reimbursement (to be sent to all attendees)
- E-ticket/ invoice / train/bus tickets clearly showing the paid amount
- Traveling by car: 0.40 Euros/km, upon receiving the gas receipt

The participants' travel to and from the event as well as their stay during the study visit will be covered by the Council of Europe insurance.

The organisers do not offer a pre-booked ticket.

Visa

Those participants who need visa to travel to Spain are requested to fill in Appendix III and send a scanned copy of their passport. Please note that the organisers will assist with obtaining a visa for the selected participants.
